The Battle of Ocean Pond

Florida's only major Civil War Battle

Olustee Florida was the site of the only major battle of the Civil War in Florida. The Date was February 20, 1864. According to Paul M. Bessel Librarian, Author, researcher and Freemason and Allen E. Roberts author of House Undivided, the number of Generals for the Union Army that were Freemasons was 95. The Confederacy processed 61 Generals. The number of Freemasons, stories, and tales of Freemasons on both sides are written and retold. There were no Freemason Generals at Olustee on February 20, 1864.

The two Generals that were involved were General Truman Seymour of the Union Army, and General Joseph Finnigan of the Confederate Army. General Seymour had been dispatched by General Truman Quincy from Charleston S. C. to Jacksonville. General Seymour raided parts of Northeast Florida beginning February 7, 1864. He advanced with Union troops with three regiments of Black soldiers – the 54th Massachusetts Infantry (the 54th was depicted in the Movie Glory), the 35th US Colored Troops, and the 8th US Colored Troops. His job was to capture Slaves who would fight in the Union Army, and disrupt supply lines from Florida (food, sugar, beef, turpentine) and disrupt railroads, or anything he could in Florida. He was followed by John Hay, Secretary of State under Abraham Lincoln, who would begin a provisional Union Government in Florida. This could be done with 10% of the pre-war population. Seymour began moving west to Lake City Florida to destroy a railroad bridge and secure North Florida. There were 500 Confederate troops in and around Lake City. General Beauregard, Confederate General in Georgia, received reports of troop movements and sent troops to Florida. Finnegan had chosen an area 13 miles to the East of Lake City with strong natural defenses, including Ocean Pond to the north, an impassable swamp to the south, with a narrow dry passage in between. By the time the two sides began to skirmish near the Olustee railroad station, each side had about 5,000 troops. Finnegan troops included the 6th Florida Battalion; the 1st, 23rd, 27th, and the remainder of the 32nd Georgia Regiments, and the Chatham Artillery. Throughout the day of February 20, 1864, the battle raged. For four hours, 10,000 men, some 5,000 on each side, stood and shot. And stood and shot. Towards the end of the day the Union line broke and the Union retreated to Jacksonville. A Confederate victory, the "skirmish" left 203 Union soldiers and 93 Confederates dead. The Confederate Army lost less soldiers and had fewer injuries than the Union Army. The Confederate Army had recovered 5 ordinances, and several horses. The Battle at Olustee had been and was considered a Confederate Victory. The state of Florida remained a Confederate state until the end of the War. The Olustee Battle had been deemed one of the bloodiest battles, due to the fact there was no cover and the shooting went on for four hours in pine trees. In the Book, Florida's Past Vol 1 by Gene M. Bennet, a chapter is included called Private's Eye View of the Olustee Battle. Union Private Milton M Woodford would write to his wife detailing the battle, and it would become a record of the battle. In the letter he reports of General Seymour leading more men to death. "He showed very poor Generalship taking us into a place like this." It was reported that the Union had retreated back to near Jacksonville when the Union 8th Regiment was ordered to return, A train of injured Union soldiers were on board and the train stopped. The Union 8th pulled the train with ropes and horses about 10 miles, and it took 42 hours to reach the camp near Jacksonville.

The Battlefield of Olustee is near the Osceola National Forest and the Battlefield Park became the first Florida State Park.

BROTHER AGAINST BROTHER

Decades of tension and political strife over slavery, westward expansion, and disputed lands lead to the start of the American Civil War in 1861. Our nation was wrought with divisiveness, the North and South, Union and Confederacy, vying for control while the country entered one of its darkest and most formative chapters of development. A once thriving nation, proud of the freedom, industry, and ingenuity of a new world, dissolved into war.

This fragmentation of our unified state presented an alarming struggle in Freemasonry: Brother fighting Brother. Fathers, sons, and fraternal brothers were often in opposition, still connected by the Masonic values of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. How did these values of light and honor in Freemasonry prevail during a time of such darkness? Historical records document countless Masonic acts of compassion, where Masons worked to ease the suffering of fellow brethren through charitable Relief, despite division. Loyalty to the craft prevailed. There are countless examples that Masons provided resources to both Masonic brothers that were allies and also enemies during the conflict.

One of my favorite stories is found in the records of a lodge in Savannah, Georgia. It is a story of how, with the Civil War raging, Confederate soldiers helped a Union Brother complete a Masonic degree. According to an article from the Georgia Masonic Messenger, shortly after the start of the war, Union soldiers captured the beaches on Hilton Head. Before long, the northerners sent a message under the white flag to the Confederate Soldiers. A Union soldier had passed through the Fellowcraft Degree before shipping out, and they wanted to see if a nearby lodge could test and raise him to a Master Mason. Within days, a detail of Confederate cavalry escorted the Fellowcraft Mason and several Master Masons of the North safely through the Confederate Lines and over 30 miles of Confederate defenses to Savannah and the local Masonic lodge. The records note that this Brother was proficient in the Fellowcraft Degree, and he was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. After the ritual was complete, the Confederate cavalry returned their Brothers to Hilton Head without incident. Brotherly love and Masonic Fraternal bonds trumped all, even the Civil War! Remember your obligation my Brothers.

Instructive Tongue

The solemn promise made by a Freemason on his admission to any degree is technically called an obligation. In a legal sense, *obligation* is synonymous with *duty*. It is derived from the Latin word obligate, which literally signifies a *tying or binding*. The obligation is that which binds a man to do some act, the doing of which thus becomes his duty.

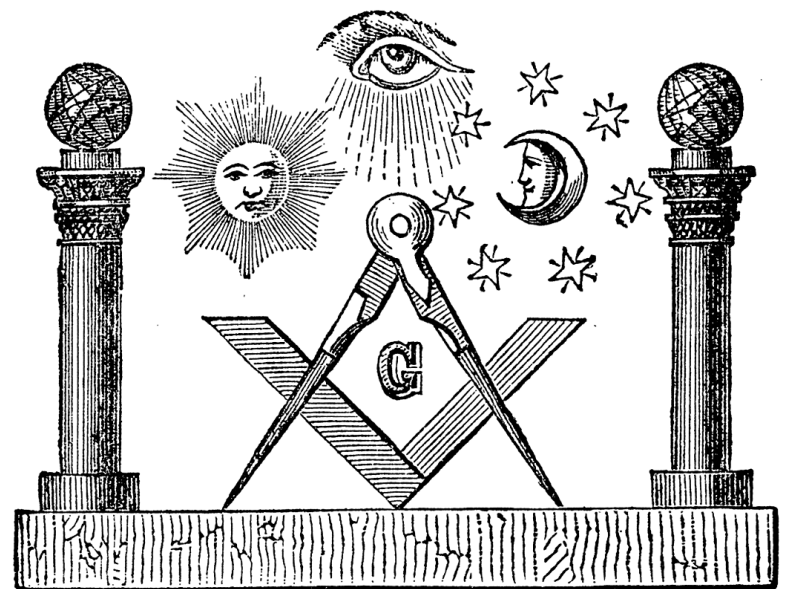
