



Passover Redemptions D.J. Reilly

During Passover, our Jewish Brethren celebrate with a Seder. Passover is a remembrance of the night death passed over the Israelites homes, those with lamb's blood painted around the door. Pharoah had commanded that all first born Israelites be killed. GOD allowed the angel of death to Kill the first born of all Egyptians instead. Seder is a ceremony of the meal on that horrible night. The Seder begins with praise, singing, family, love, with symbolism. Freemasonry includes the Jewish philosophy in its teachings. In fact Scottish Rite Freemasonry is special for us all to take part in all religions, faiths and celebrations as it is a way to dispute hate, fanaticism and ignorance. While we maintain our own faith in our own beliefs, yet we seek out other light, and contemplate the knowledge.

In our Scottish Rite Ceremony of Lights, we speak of the Seder table and the items on the Seder plate. Below are the items and meanings on the Seder Plate:

1. Maror

This is the bitter herb, which reminds the Jews of the bitterness of the slavery their ancestors endured in Egypt.

2. Z'roa

Usually a roasted lamb shank bone, the Z'roa is just for show to represent the lamb that was sacrificed the night the Jews left Egypt.

3. Charoset

The Charoset is meant to resemble the mortar and brick made by the Jews when they were slaves in Egypt under Pharaoh. The recipe includes raisins, nuts, dates, wine, and cinnamon.

4. Chazeret

A second bitter item is romaine lettuce and symbolizes the fact that the Jewish stay in Egypt began soft and ended hard and bitter. (Note the ends of the lettuce)

5. Karpas

Typically represented with parsley (although some families use boiled potatoes), the Karpas is a symbol of spring and new beginnings.

There are two other items that are new to the Seder Plate.

- 1. Orange Some Jews include an orange on the Seder plate. The orange represents the fruitfulness for all Jews when marginalized Jews, particularly women and gay people, are allowed to become active and contribute to the Jewish community. Seder participants were invited to spit out the seeds as a gesture of repudiation of homophobia. (The tradition dates to the 1980s, when Susannah Heschel, a Jewish feminist scholar and the daughter of Jewish social justice icon Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel)
- 2. Olive An olive to express solidarity with Palestinians has been added to some Seder plates.

Another item and that which we are most likely to know is Matzo. Matzo is a cracker of unleavened bread. Matzo is a bread and is a reminder that when the Hebrews left Egypt they were in haste and the bread did not have time to rise. It is also significant with the time times they wandered in the wilderness.

The Seder table also includes four glasses or goblets of wine. Each of the glasses are consumed with prayer in remembering the redemptions GOD promised the Israelites. The Four Redemptions are listed below.

- 1. Salvation from harsh labor—this began as soon as the plagues were introduced.
- 2. Salvation from servitude; or the day the Jews left Egypt geographically and arrived at Ramses.
- 3. The splitting of the sea, after which the Jews felt completely redeemed, without fear of the Egyptians recapturing them.
- 4. Becoming a nation of Sinai.

Some Seder Tables include a 5th cup of wine which is a silent cup or Elijah's cup. Upon the conclusion of the Seder's Grace After Meals, there is an accepted custom to pour a cup of wine (the "Cup of Elijah"), open the front door of the home, and recite several verses (mostly from Psalms) wherein we beseech God to pour His wrath upon our persecutors and oppressors. The Torah explains that Passover testifies the protection GOD has for his people and opening the door is a trust, or belief of the protection provided. Elijah is also present at the Circumcision of every Hebrew Child, and that everyone present at Passover has been Circumcised and may partake.



In Honor of Memorial Day this month, words to reflect.

May has somehow snuck up on us, and with it comes Mother's Day, the approaching end of the school year, but most importantly, Memorial Day. Unfortunately to many, Memorial Day has become a day that marks the approach of summer and just another three-day weekend with great sales at the mall. In many cases the true sanctity and meaning behind Memorial Day has been lost and forgotten over time and replaced with commercialism and family vacations. However, the true meaning of Memorial Day goes far beyond barbecues and sales, so before firing up the grill or packing for the weekend vacation, we should take a little time to remember what it is exactly we are celebrating. The Memorial Day holiday dates back to the American Civil War, and at that time was known as "Decoration Day", and included the practice of placing flowers on the graves of both Union and Confederate soldiers for solemn remembrance. While it was originally founded to honor the soldiers who died in the Civil War, today, Memorial Day is a day of remembrance to honor all of the men and women who have served and died in military service for the US Armed Forces.

One needs only to watch the nightly news or keep up with world events to realize how fortunate we are to live in a country governed by a constitution that guarantees our rights and freedoms. These freedoms that America enjoy are the envy of the world, yet we so often take them for granted. They came at a heavy price and were paid for with flesh and blood by the brave sacrifices of American servicemen and women, and with the tears of those whose lives were changed forever by the loss of a loved one. Let us pledge to rededicate ourselves to not take a single day for granted, to give thanks for all that we are blessed with, and to honor those who gave their lives in service to our great nation to secure our freedoms and way of life. Grand Lodge Session 2023




